Innovation Blooms: OLEP Projects Continue to Evolve

This portfolio work is centered on the use of outdoor environments to enhance student learning within both formal and informal curricula. It involves collaboration between Australian and Filipino educators and students to create and design outdoor spaces with natural materials. This promotes Learning Through Play and the development of teaching materials for mainstream subjects that utilize outdoor settings. A key objective is to identify methods to improve the outdoor physical environment to support student learning.

The Multipurpose Outdoor Learning Domain (MOLD) outdoor furniture project has been highly successful. Installations of MOLD in schools are complete, and finances have been settled. Teachers incorporate them into their teaching programs, and students engage with them for learning through play during breaks. Parents use the MOLDs to listen to their children read.

Each school has developed an action plan for outdoor learning and has a recorded history of their Outdoor Learning Environment Program (OLEP). Efforts are underway to re-examine the conceptual scaffolding and philosophy of Outdoor Learning, emphasizing creative play, in consultation with all stakeholders as the program develops in the Talomo schools.



Much Anticipated Talomo Educators visit nears

The AFFLIP Board eagerly anticipates the arrival of seven School-based Literacy Coordinators and their team leader from Talomo District. They will be in Adelaide from October 27th until November 6th. During their stay, they'll visit five schools, spending a day at each to observe reading programs in action and engage with teachers and school leaders.

Our thanks go to Parkside Primary School, St Martins Catholic School, Banksia Park Primary School, Unley Primary School, and Prospect North Primary School for generously sharing their literacy programs and time with our visiting delegates.
